Reply to the letter from Christoph Hess and Thies Kaspareit dated 13.08.2009

I am particularly concerned that we don't beat around the bush. The heart of the debate must be the correctness of principles, the effectiveness of methods and the softness of techniques in order to achieve a respectful training of the horse and produce quality teachers.
